


Alcohol Poisoning

Signs and Symptoms

- Confusion
- Severely slurred speech
- Co-ordination loss
- Vomiting
- Slow or irregular breathing
- Pale or blue tinged skin
- Being unresponsive
- Unconsciousness

In most severe cases, alcohol poisoning can lead to coma, brain damage and death.



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What Should you do?

If you suspect alcohol poisoning, dial 999 immediately. While you are waiting:

- Keep them sitting up and awake
- Give them water
- If they have passed out, lie them on their side in the recovery position check they're breathing
- Keep them warm
- Stay with them

What Should you NOT do?



- Never leave them alone to 'sleep it off'
- Do not give them coffee
- Don't put them under a cold shower
